# THE HOLY SPIRIT, PENTECOST AND GIFTS

## New challenges

We often feel unsure every time we embark on a new venture or face a new challenge ... We often come face to face with a dilemma — whether to go ahead or to give up ... whether we're really up for the task ahead.

Can you think of any situations like that — when you weren't sure about the next step?

In situations like these we wish someone could help — someone to give us that little push, a bit of encouragement, a bit of advice ... someone we know we can go to if things start to go wrong or if we happen to be going through a rough patch ... a close friend ... someone who's been through it before ... teacher ... parent.

# C Gifts

#### From the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

There are many different gifts, but it is always the same Spirit; there are many different ways of serving, but it is always the same Lord. There are many different forms of activity, but in everybody it is the same God who is at work in them all. The particular manifestation of the Spirit granted to each one is to be used for the general good.

To one is given from the Spirit the gift of utterance expressing wisdom; to another the gift of utterance expressing knowledge, in accordance with the same Spirit; to another, the working of miracles; to another, prophecy; to another, the power of distinguishing spirits; to one, the gift of different tongues and to another, the interpretation of tongues. But at work in all these is one and the same Spirit, distributing them at will to each individual.


