

JOHN HENRY NEWMAN


Priest - Theologian - Writer - Poet

Born into a well off family in London, right at the dawn of the nineteenth century in 1801, John H Newman grew up to become such a well known theologian whose life and works continue to be studied now, 130 years after his death.

Following his time and work in the Anglican Church, Newman was received into the Catholic Faith in October 1845. This move or 'conversion' came after years of reflection and analysis by this great thinker who by then had gone through a whole series of phases

involving research, prayer and apostolic work within the church as a priest, writing and giving sermons. The work of his entire life can be summoned in the short epitaph on his grave in Birmingham - 'Ex umbris et imaginibus in veritatem' - (Out of shadows and images into the truth).

Newman was declared Blessed in September 2010 and following a second approved miracle is now going to be canonized in Rome on Sunday 13th October 2019. His life journey of discovery is a truly inspiring model for those who seek to carry on searching for the truth no matter what life experiences take them through or how many hurdles they have to overcome.

Nineteen years after the publication of the **Catechism of the Catholic church,** the first **Youcat** publication was launched in 2011 when the **Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church**, (Yellow **YOUCAT**), was published as a more youth friendly version of the original Catechism. This **YOUCAT** consist of 527 questions and answers organised in four chapters. Since then it has been published in many different languages.
