TWO YOUNG WITNESSES TO THE FAITH

Most people have heard of Carlo Acutis and Piergiorgio Frassati, two young Catholics who were officially declared a saints by Pope

Leo on Sunday 7th September 2025 at the Vatican.

These two young people - a young man from the early 20th century and a teenager from the time of the new millennium, were two people who discovered Jesus and were ready to give everything for him. Pier Giorgio encountered the Lord through school and church groups and bore witness to God with his joy of living and of being a Christian in prayer, friendship and charity. Carlo Acutis also encountered Jesus through his family as well as school but

above all in the sacraments celebrated in the parish community. He then expressed his commitment to his faith through prayer and everything else he did - sport, study and charity work.

These two young saints are now being presented to us as **role models**. Age is not what matters here. Yes they were young and their lives were cut short, but for us

they are great witnesses of Discipleship that translates itself into the fundamentals of the Christian faith - Prayer, Devotion to the Holy Eucharist, Devotion to Mary our mother and learning from other saints and then expressing all this in acts of love of neighbour and

charity work.

In his homily during the mass of Canonisation, Pope Leo stressed that Pier Giorgio Frassati and Carlo Acutis are an **invitation to all of us**, especially young people, not to squander our

lives, but to direct them upwards and make them **masterpieces**. Their lives and commitment to their faith are being presented to us as a simple formula and a type of witness we are called to follow in order to enjoy life to the full and meet the Lord in the feast of heaven.

AWAY DAYS - LAKE DISTRICT

During the May half term week a trip to the Lake District area was organised as an opportunity for the group to spend a few away days for reflection on the Jubilee Year of Hope as well as visiting



places of interest in the Cumbria and Lancashire areas.

We left on Thursday morning and first stopped in North London for mass. We then proceeded to the North but made a stop over in Sheffield. On Friday and Saturday we attended mass in different parishes and explored the area including a number of towns and villages in the Lake District and beyond. Every evening we met for prayers and our daily reflections on the theme of **Hope**. On our way back to London on Sunday we stopped for Mass at **Lancaster Cathedral**, one of the designated Jubilee Year shrines for the diocese of Lancaster.

REFLECTING ON FRANCIS OF ASSISI AND THE VIRTUE OF POVERTY



Our most recent away day trip took place on the 4th October, memorial feast of **St Francis of Assisi** we focused on the life of this saint and particularly the virtue of **Poverty**. We first stopped for mass at St Joseph's parish church, Epsom. We then proceeded to Maryfield convent in Hook, where we spent time together which included reflections on the life of St Francis, a Bible session on the episode of **the Rich Young Man**, the Rosary prayer and other prayers in the convent chapel.
